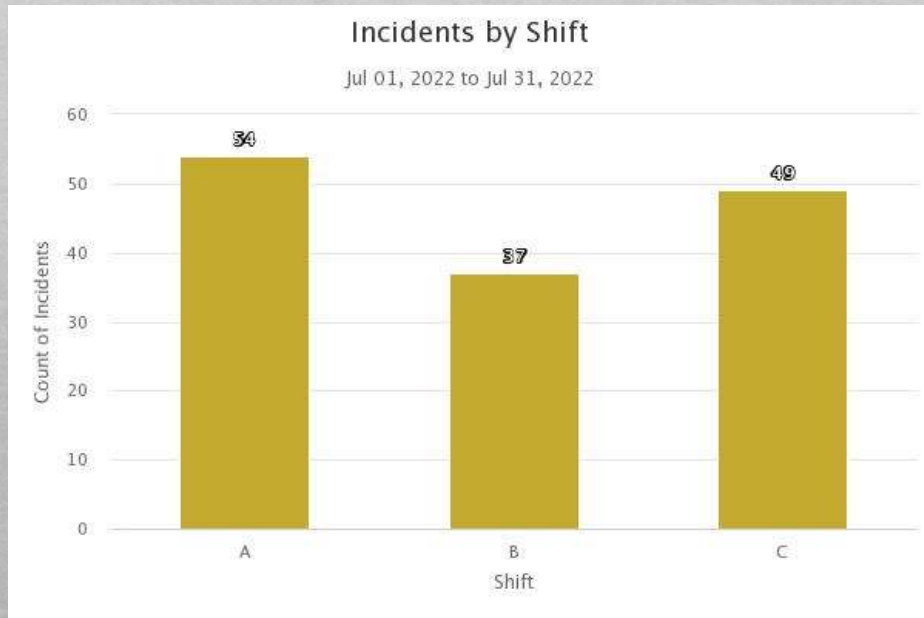

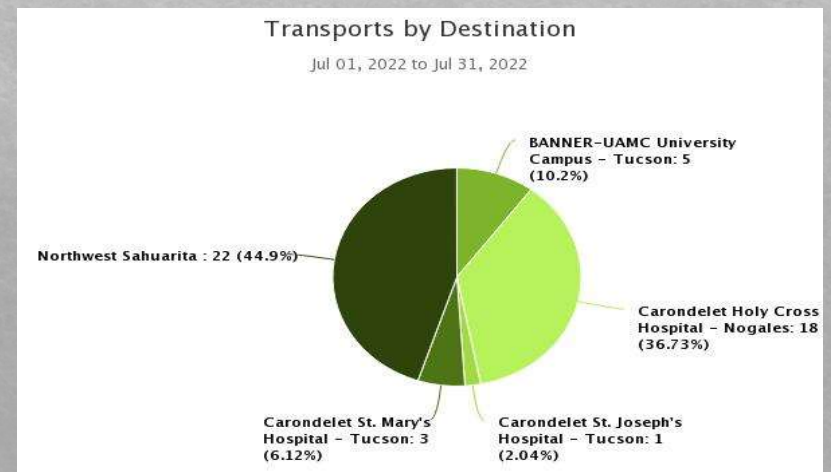

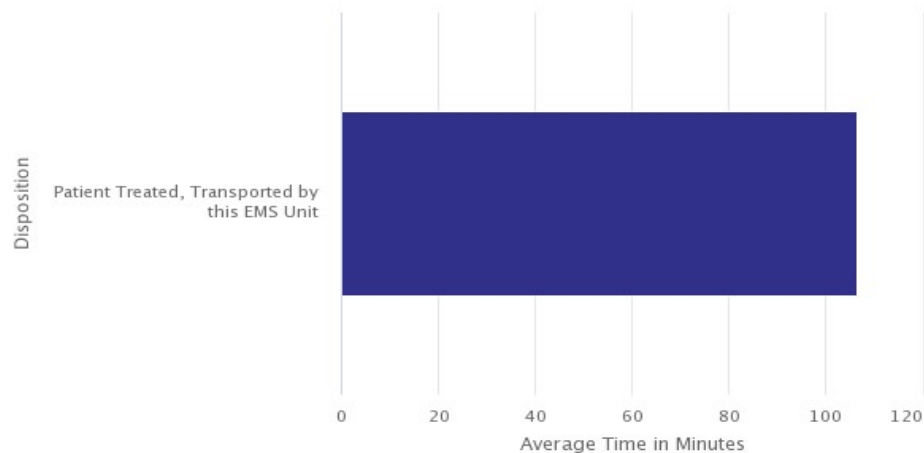

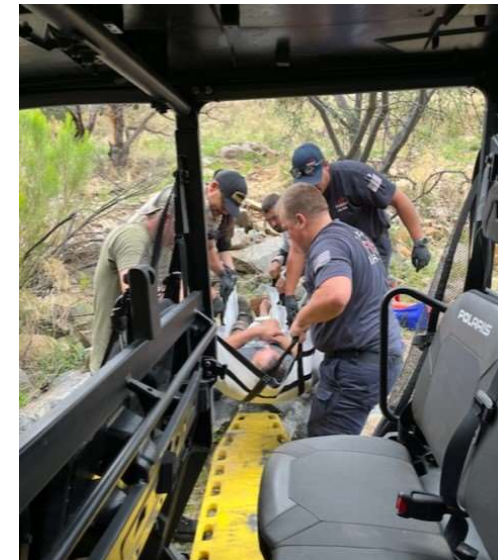
## July Trends

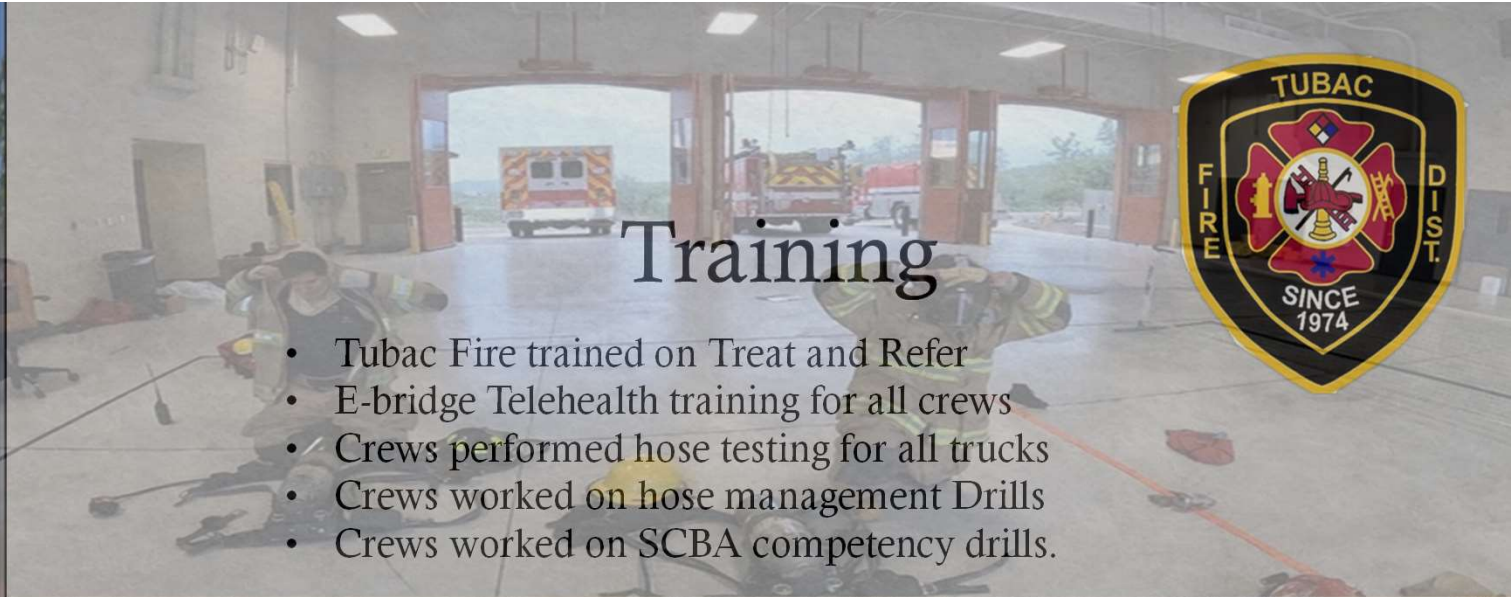


- ◇ Fire Alarm False alarms (due to monsoon)

- ◆ Tubac Tender 721 responded to Arivaca for a Structure fire on July 12. Tender 721 provided water to the operation by shuttling water back and forth to the scene.
- ◆ Tubac Fire responded to Forest Service Rd 143 for reports a dirt bike accident. Crews responded in our ambulances as well as the Polaris Ranger and were able to gain access to the patient. The patient was stable and was transported to UMC main by ground.





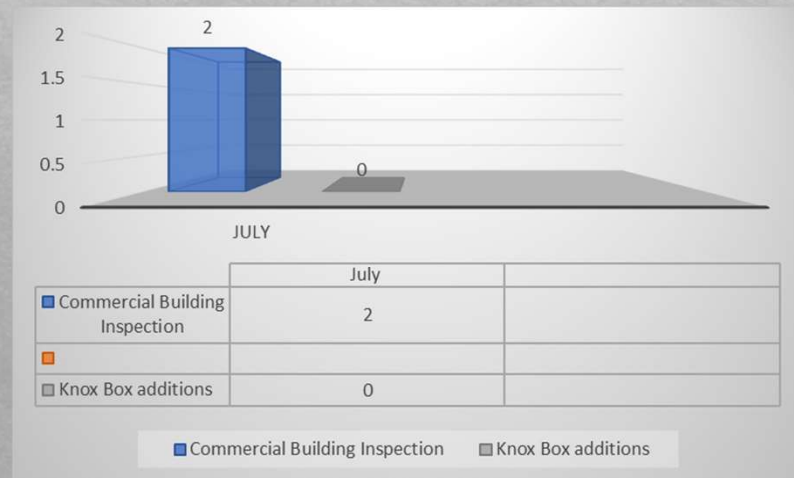
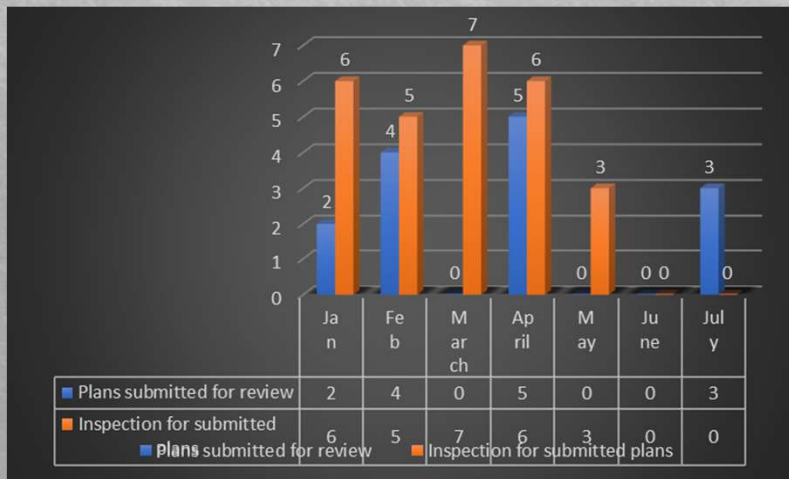
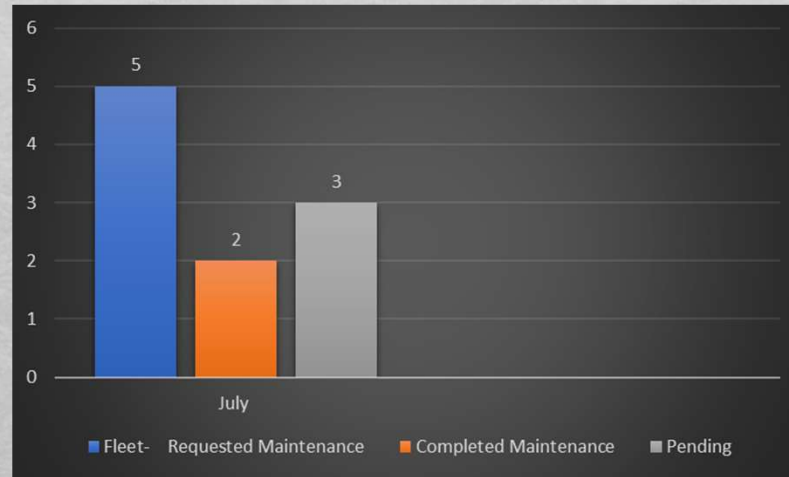
- Tubac Fire trained on Treat and Refer

- Crews worked on SCBA competency drills.

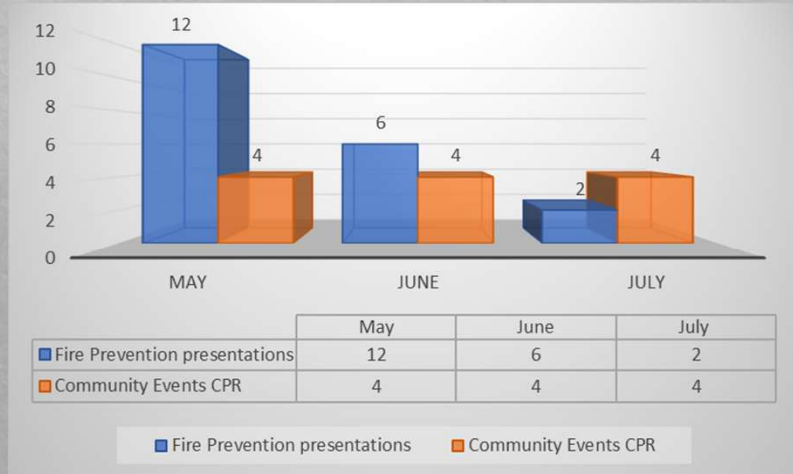




# Public Education

- ◆ In the coming months we will be working with the ICSAVE organization and will be training schools and other vulnerable entities on the “Stop the Bleed” curriculum.

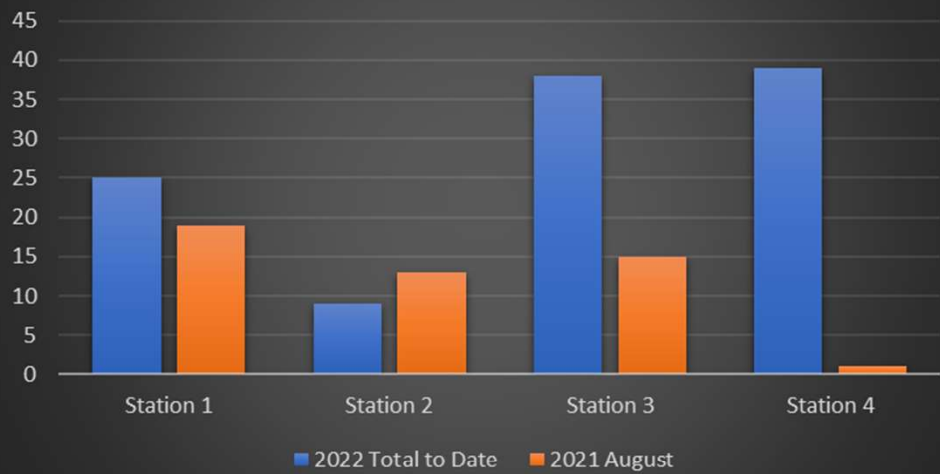
