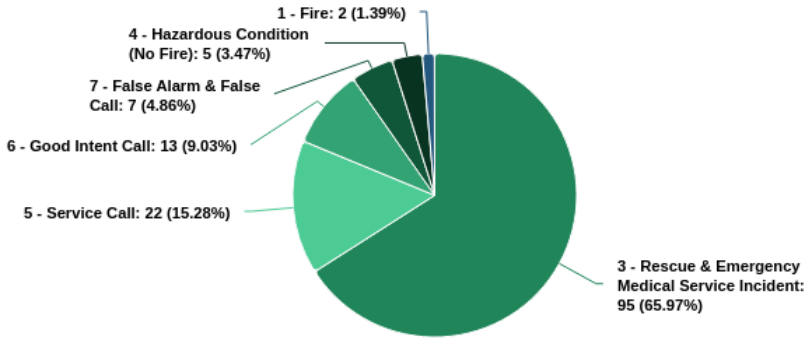

Apr 01, 2024 to Apr 30, 2024



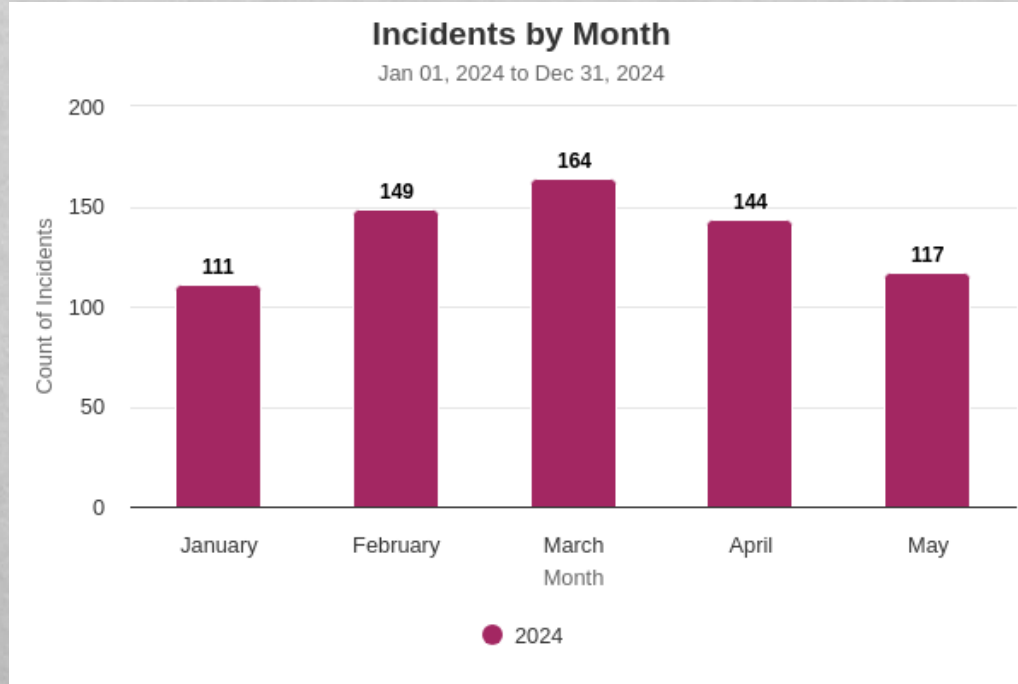

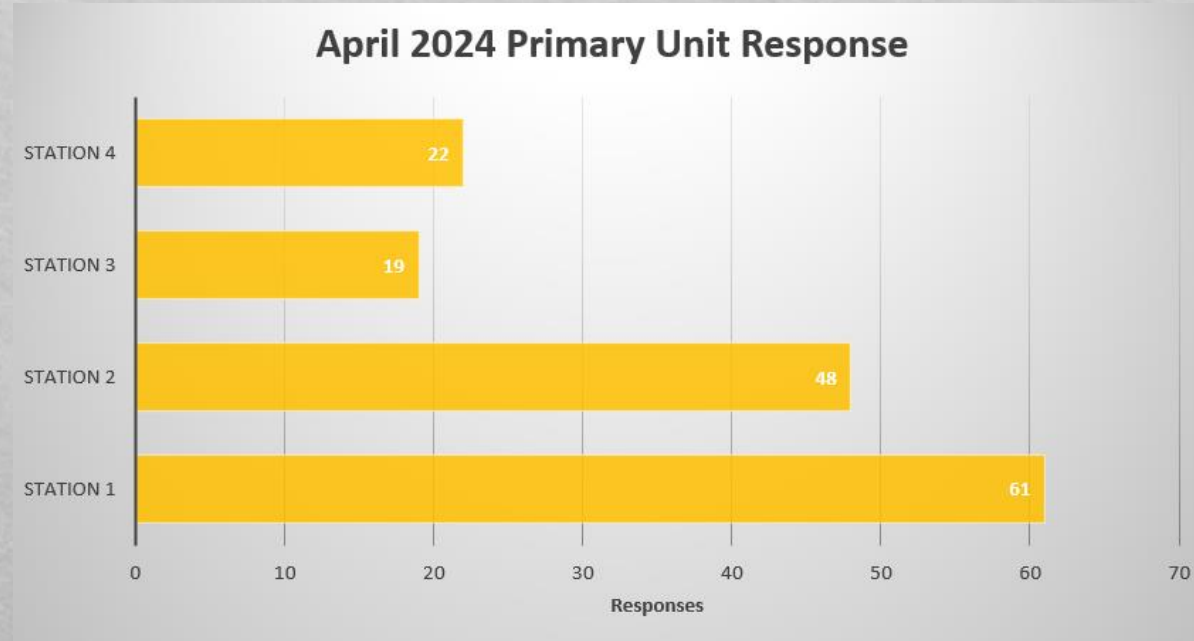

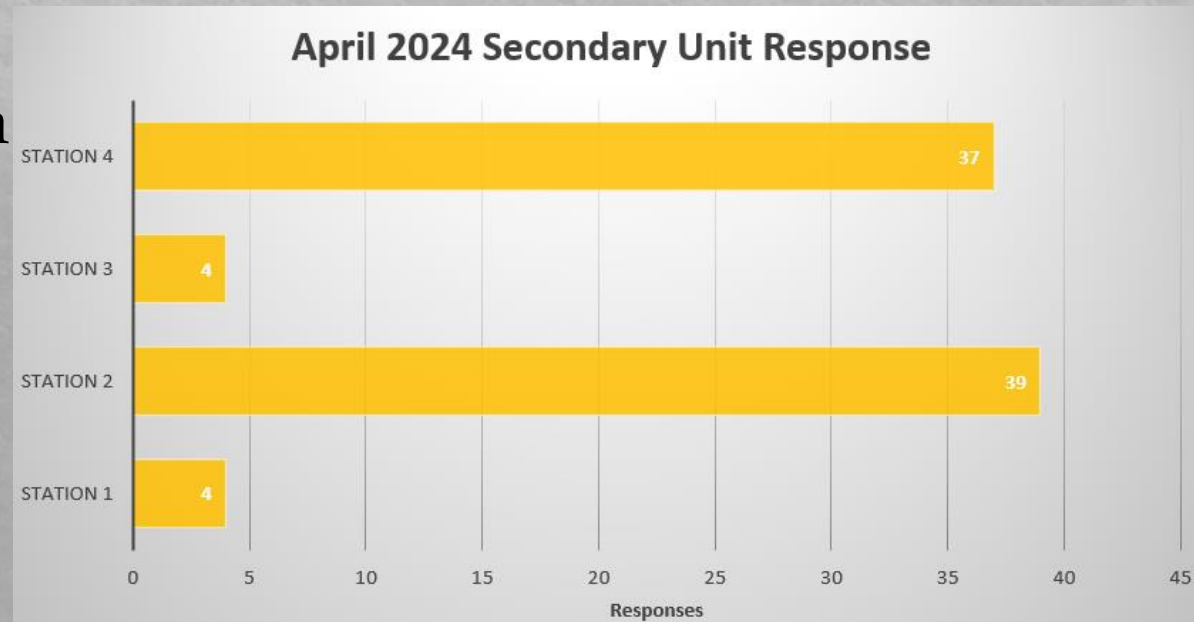

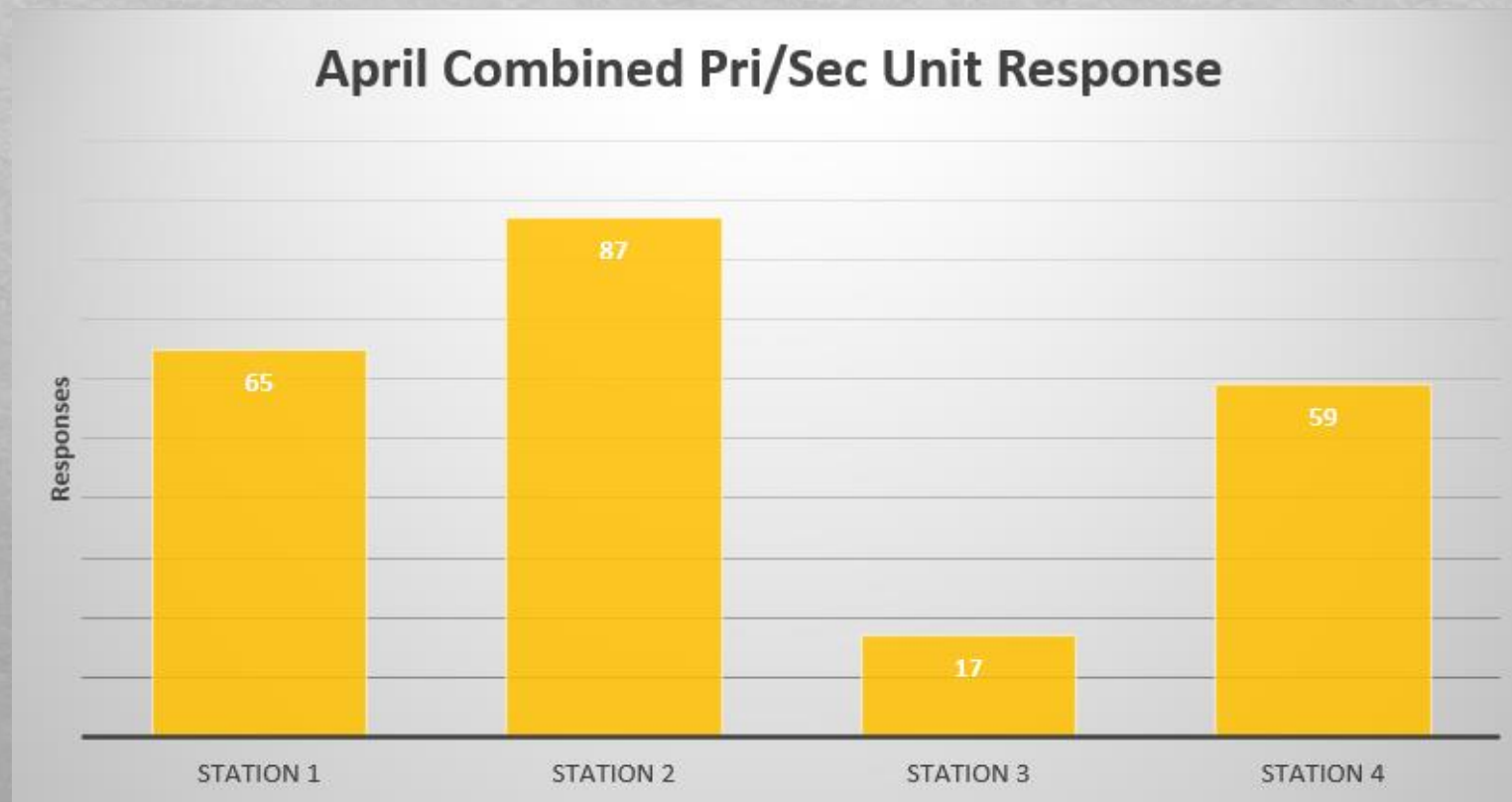

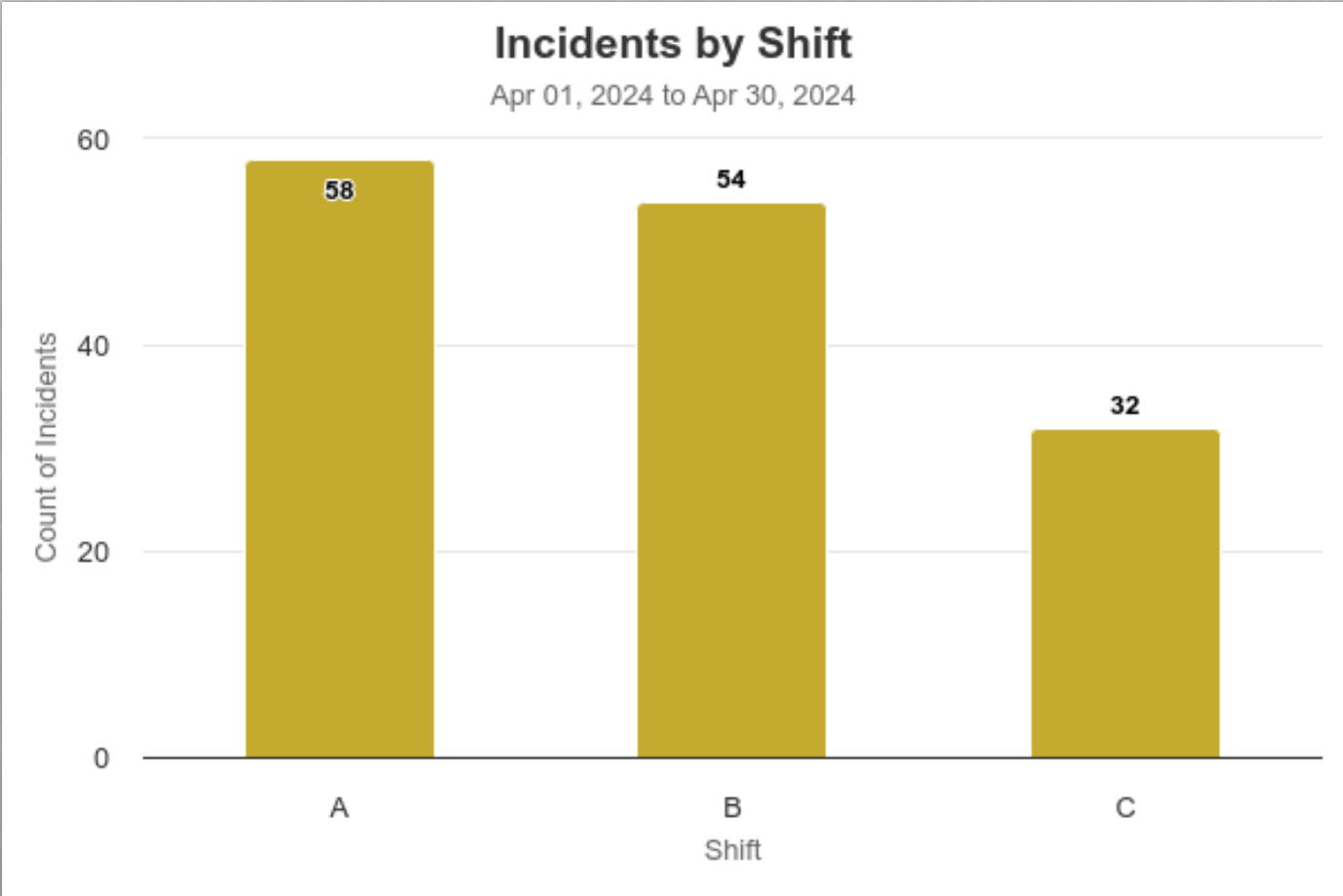

Significant Calls



- C Shift Responded to Madera Canyon for a patient who sustained an ankle injury approximately 2 Miles on the Super Trail. It took 13 personnel and approximately 6 hours to complete the rescue safely
- B Shift Responded to the West Frontage rd for a report of a vehicle on fire. Crew arrived to find one vehicle with the engine and front cab engulfed in flames.
- Significant EMS calls:
 - a. Elderly Patient having a myocardial infarction and flown to a Tucson hospital for definitive care.
 - b. Severe difficulty breathing transported to closest facility for stabilization. Unknown Etiology
 - c. Elderly patient in a diabetic coma, crews arrived and were able to reverse the symptoms of hypoglycemia through IV medications. Patient refused transport once they became alert.
 - d. 1 year old patient having febrile seizures, patient was transported in stable condition.
 - e. Patient who fell of a ladder with loss of consciousness and a head injury was flown to a Tucson Hospital for definitive care.

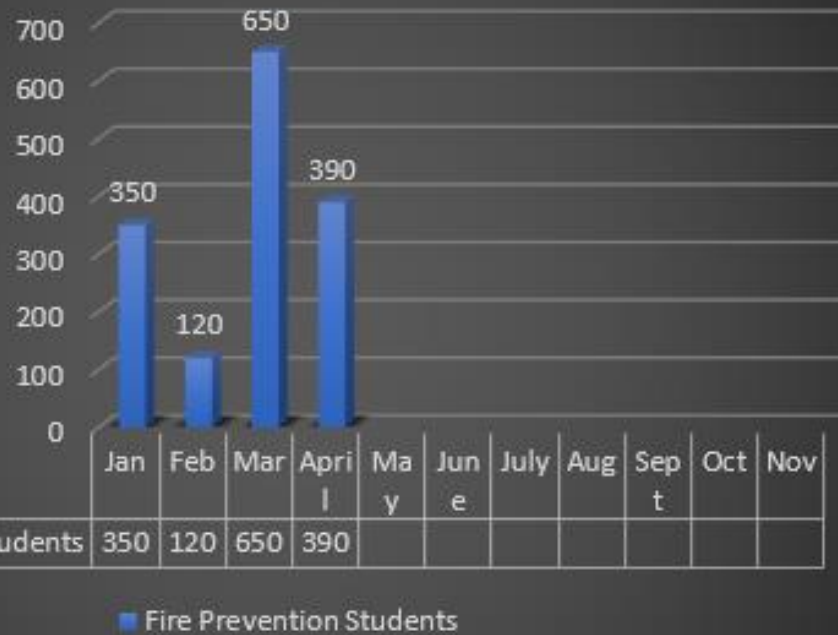


- Tubac Fire participated in multiple career days. Firefighters showcased their PPE and frontline apparatus to students aged 5-15.

- Tubac Fire continues to provide CPR classes every month to the community in English and Spanish.

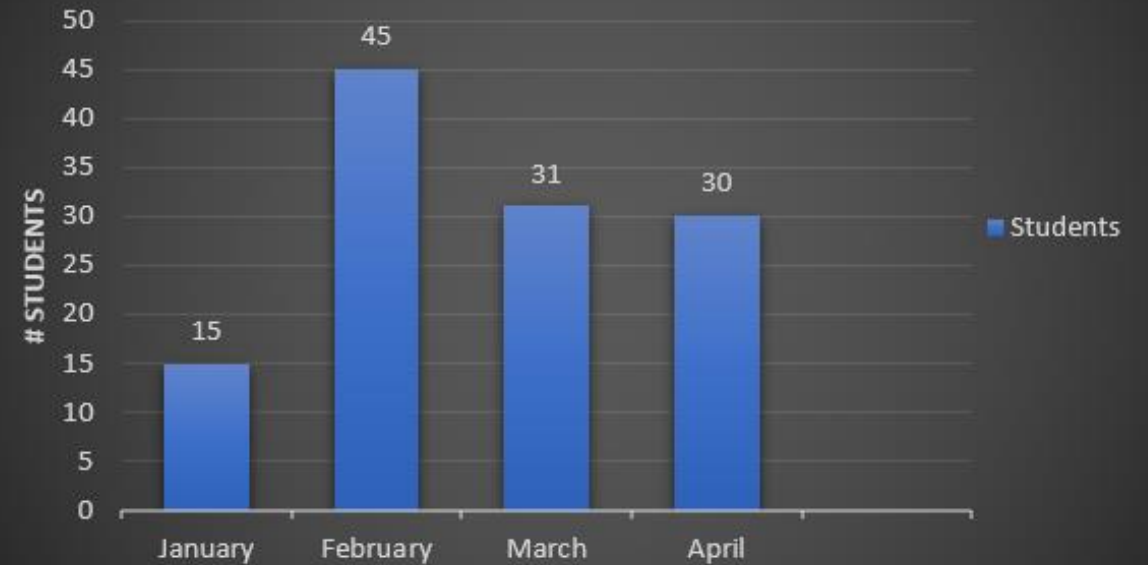




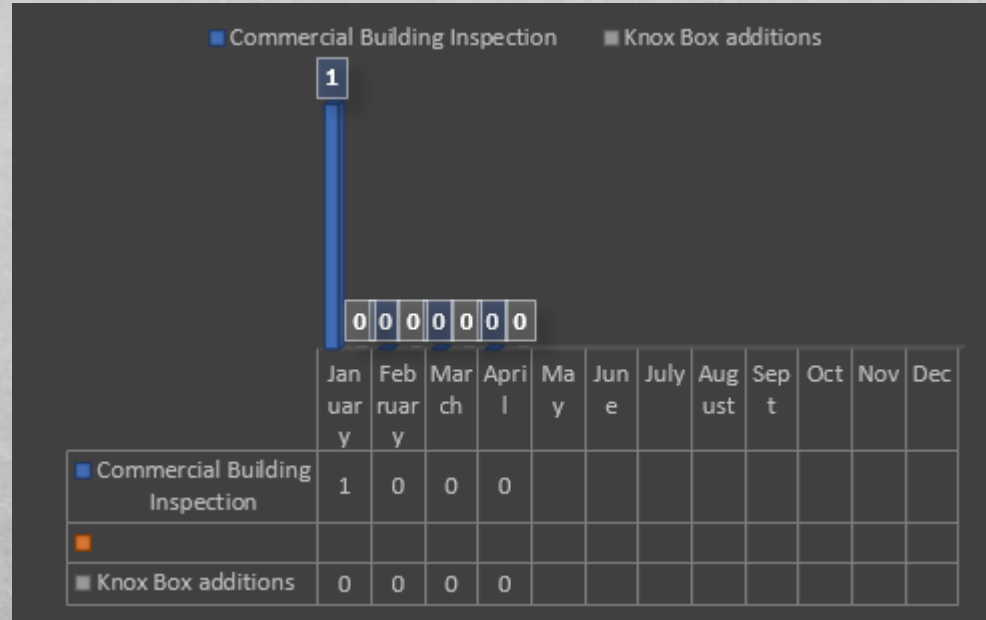
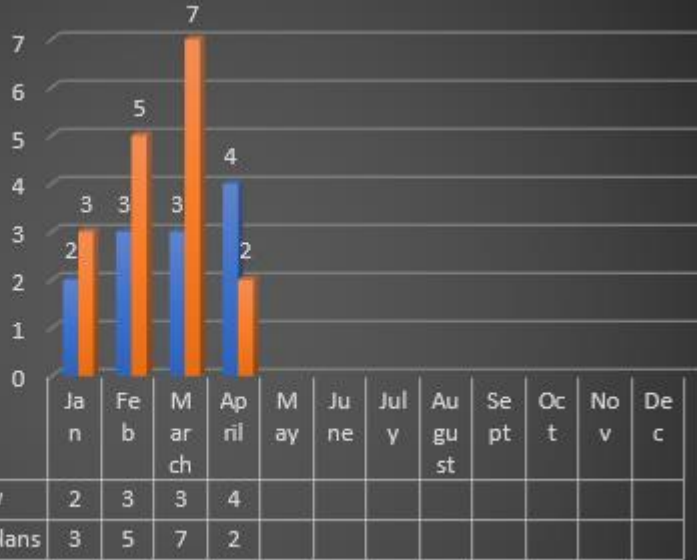

SUBJECT: TFD Apparatus Repair

DATE: May, 21, 2024

FROM: Captain John Conger

Background: Unit 1044 (E-721) needed repair of the Pump system among other engine related items. The unit was sent to Velocity Truck Center in Tucson for repairs due to its EVT (emergency vehicle technician). They found several issues with the sensors regarding the engine which directly affecting the truck's ability to pump. This unit's inability to pump is extremely concerning and poses a life safety issue.

Fiscal Impact: \$5,436.35

Alternate Option: NONE

Staff Recommendation: Staff is recommending the approval of the repairs to unit 1044. The quote provided is only an estimate and could change.

Proposed Motion: Move to authorize staff to approve the repairs of unit 1044 by Velocity Truck Center.

SUBJECT: Purchase of a staff vehicle for the Fire Chief

DATE: May 20, 2024

FROM: Captain John Conger

Background: The Tubac Fire District is replacing unit #1038, a 2009 Chevrolet 2500, with unit #1051, a 2019 Ford F150 currently used by the Fire Chief. The Fire Chief has requested an SUV to better meet the versatile demands of his role. Historically, the Fire Chief has driven an SUV due to the tasks he performs. An SUV allows the Chief to use the vehicle as a command post when he takes command of an incident. During large incidents, it may be necessary to shuttle personnel and other equipment.

Fiscal Impact: This is part of the Capital replacement schedule \$66,001.94. We have \$80,000 budgeted for this replacement.

Alternate Option: Board recommendation

Staff Recommendation: Staff is recommending the approval for the 2024 Chevrolet Tahoe for the amount of \$66,001.94.

Proposed Motion: Move to approve the purchase of a 2024 Chevrolet Tahoe from O’Rielly in an amount not to exceed \$66,001.94
