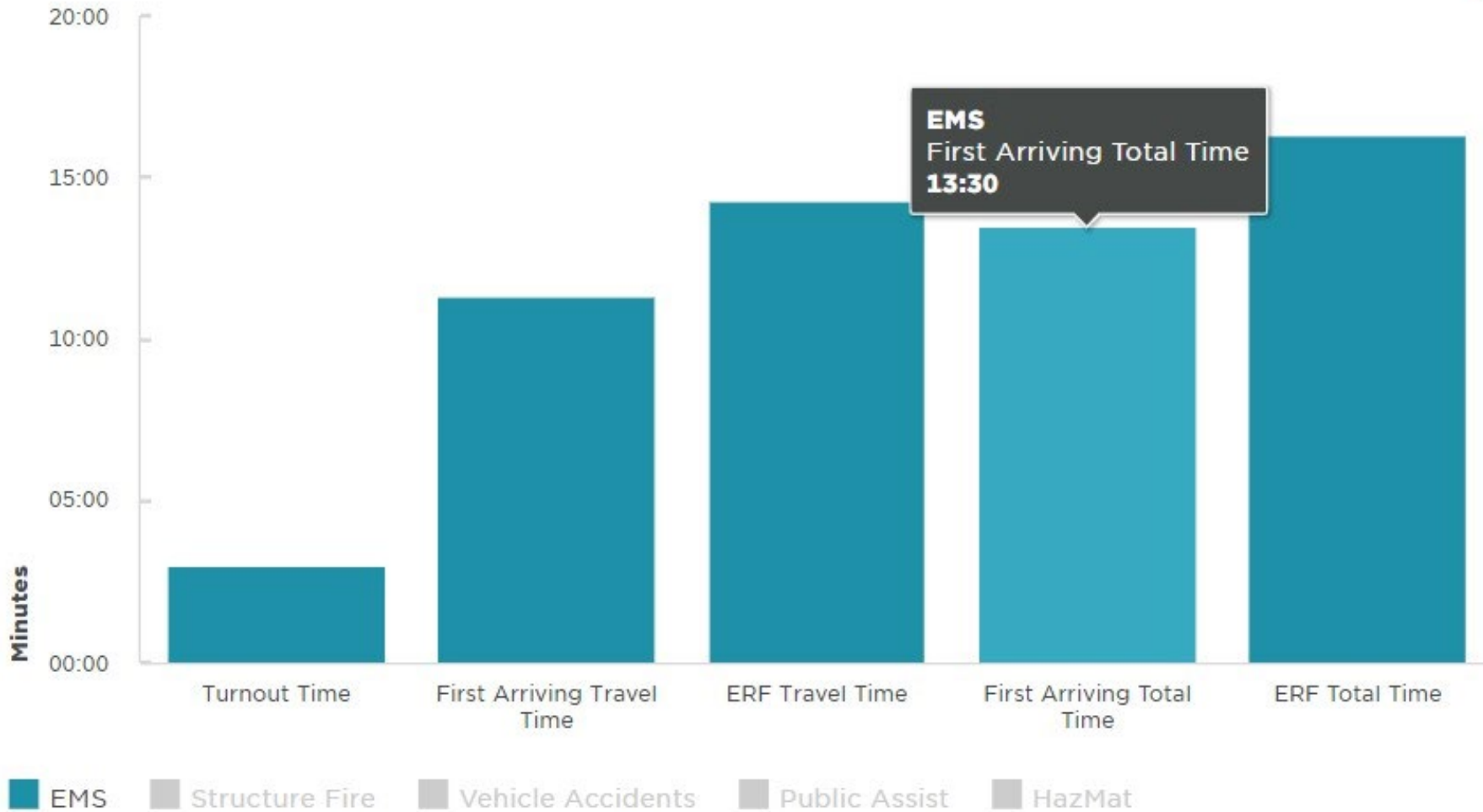

Response Time Categories by Incident Category



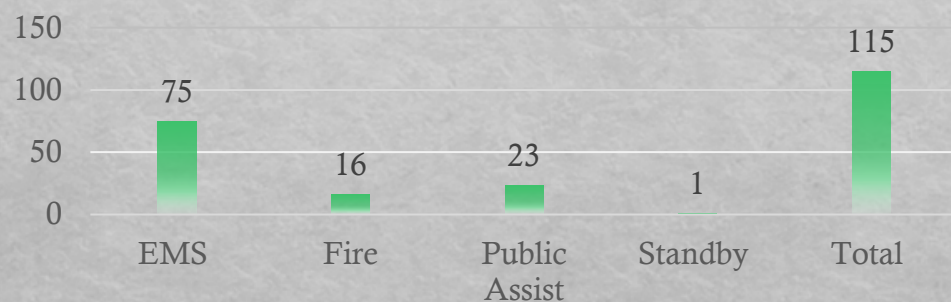

February Call Type and Station Breakdown

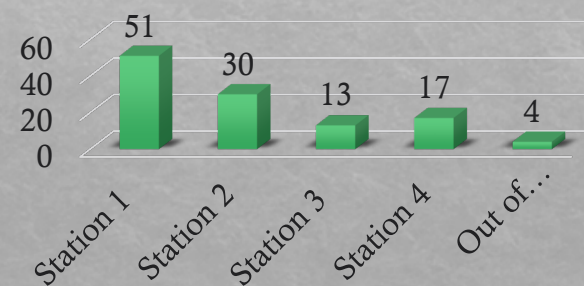

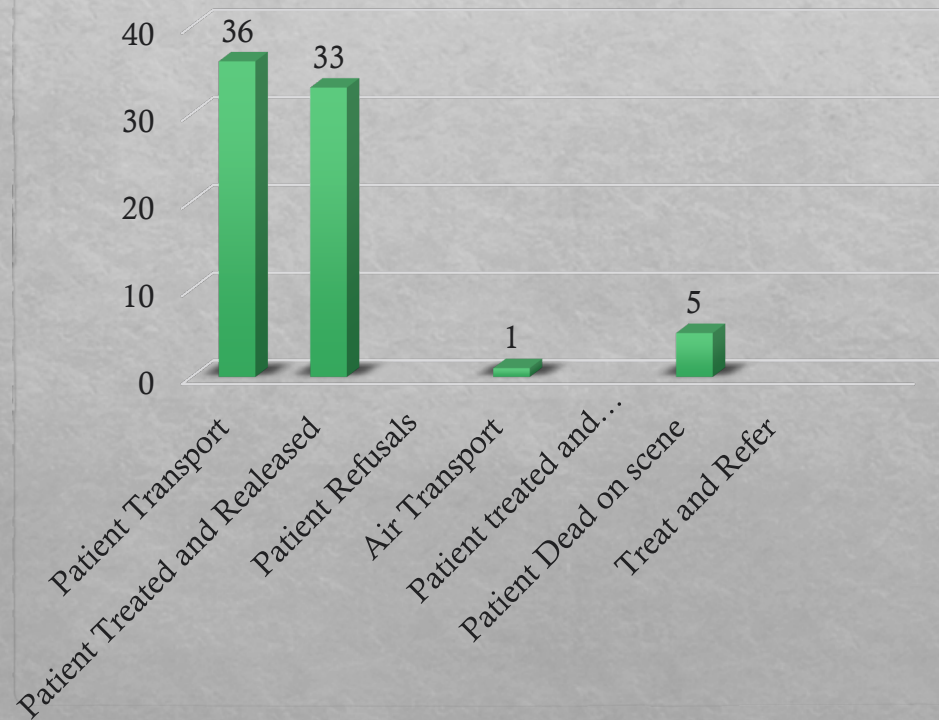
Station Breakdown

Patient Disposition



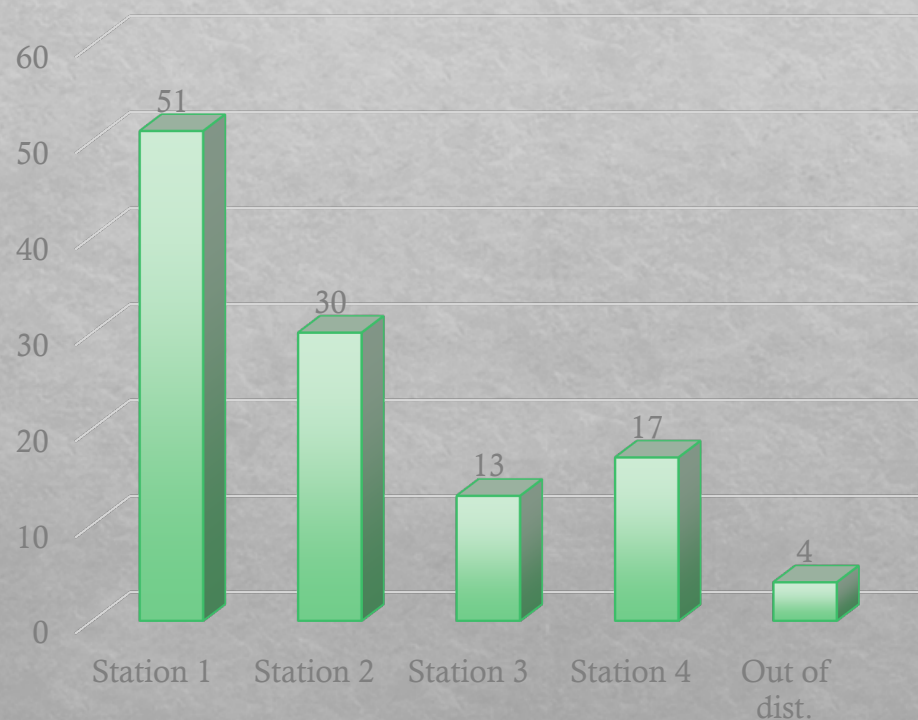
Transport Destinations



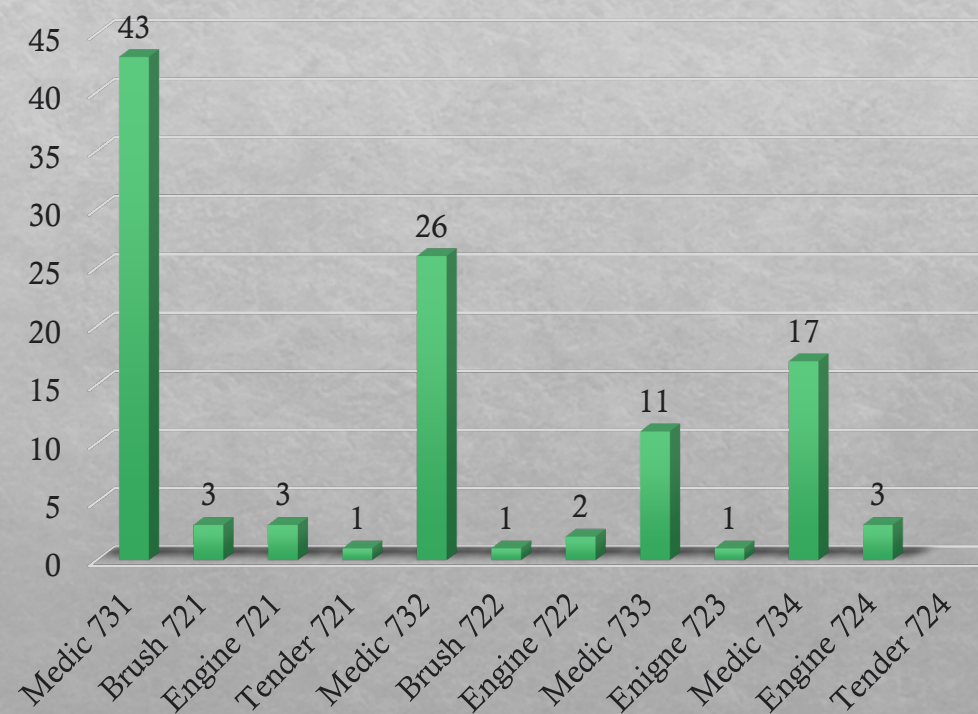


Station and Unit Breakdown

- ◆ Increase in Motor Vehicle accidents over the last two months (13)

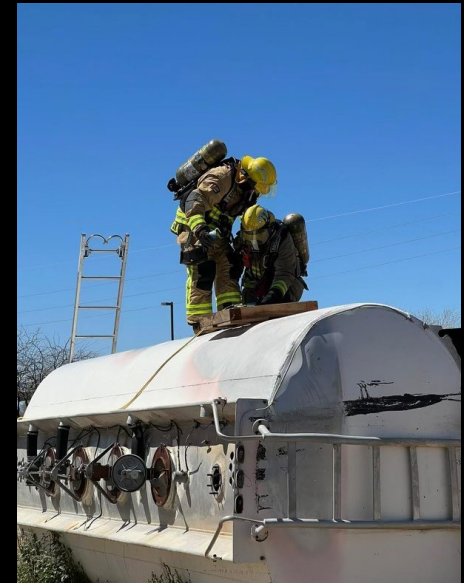
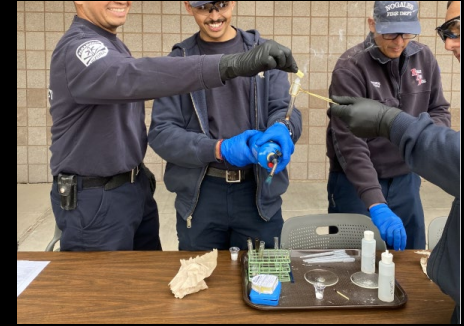
Significant calls

- ◆ **Tubac Fire Responded to the Sunflower RV park for reports of a structure fire. The fire was in the laundry room and was quickly extinguished by fire crews.**
- ◆ **Tubac Fire Responded to a mutual aid structure fire at the City of Nogales involving a commercial building.**
- ◆ **Tubac Fire units responded to a rollover involving a truck that rolled ejecting both passengers.**



Training

- ◆ Hazardous materials Technician Class – 260-hour training program
- ◆ FF/CEP Esai Tapia and FF/CEP Uriel Gonzales Graduation is set for April 1st
- ◆ EMT's have completed specialized training in Capnography, 12leads, advanced airways, and IV maintenance monitoring.
- ◆ Fire Instructor I training – Jake Merry, Charles Mills and Cristobal Mohinea attended. Certification test will be in May.
- ◆ Regional Fire academy has been going strong for the last 3 months. Students are progressing and have begun ride-along time.



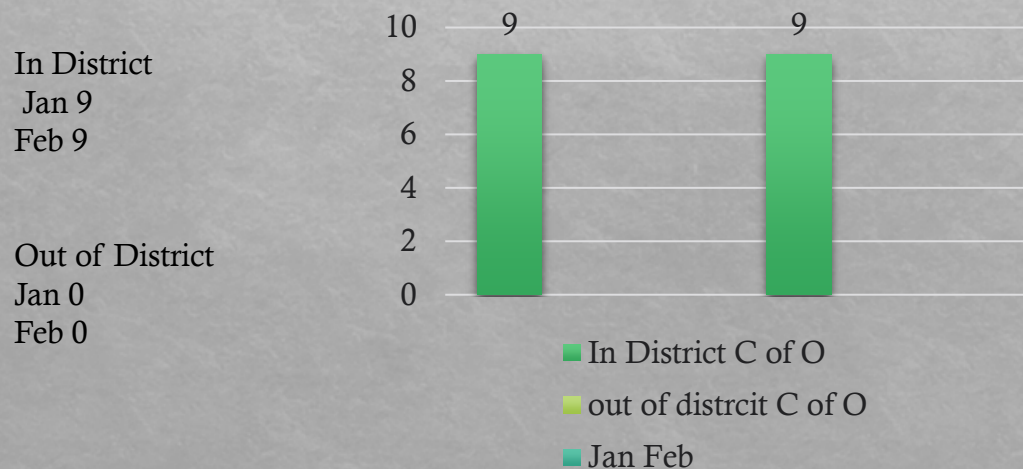
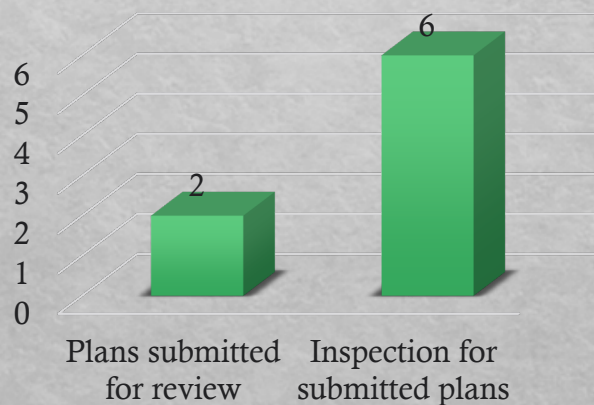
In service Equipment
